CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

WWSA Facility Tour

A tour of water plants and sewer pump stations will take place following the July 17, 2018 Board Meeting for any Board Member that would like to visit.

Proactive Notification of Issues

Since the Board meets every other month, the Board can hear about issues that may be up to 2 months old. The Chairman requests proactive notification of issues as they occur between Board Meetings.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Traver Road Water System Loop Capital Project

Change order received for time and material for vault with bypass. The contract for 1400 ft of pipe was \$104,000. The change order for time and material for installation of vault with bypass was approximately \$49,000 (material \$9.000, labor \$40,000). The amount of labor billed is in dispute as the project took longer to complete than expected. The billing for heavy equipment and operator was also billed on hourly basis vs a 2-week rate. If parties can't come to an agreement, the contract states that will go to mediation and arbitration. If the change order can be negotiated down to \$33,000, the budget for this project will need to be adjusted to accommodate the change order as follows:

Chairman MacDougall asked for a motion to authorize payment of change order bill to Bellamy Construction for up to \$33,000, and to approve a budget amendment of \$20,000 as outlined. Secretary Schneider offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Furlong Hills Pump Station Capital Project

Contract extension was granted to 5/1/18 but as of today project is still not complete. No change orders or additional money to contracted price have been requested. Estimate project completion in a couple of weeks.

Furlong Hills Water Main Break

Contractors doing work on Furlong Hills Sewer Pump Station hit water main causing water main break. A boil water order was in effect for 235 customers.

Adirondack Trust Water Line Extension

Adirondack Trust will be running water line down from Park Place on Rt 9 down to Adirondack Trust. A fire flow test was done at Park Place showing 700 gallons/min at 25 psi. Director Mooney recommends to Board to work with Adirondack Trust for an easement through their property to run the line out to Davidson Drive. This would allow the line to be looped in the future to the Mills at Smith Bridge and would double the fire flow.

Sonoma Grove Portable Water Flushing Station

A portable water flushing station was purchased for Sonoma Grove. It goes on a hydrant and can be set to flush automatically at regular intervals to prevent stagnant taste and odor issues at dead end lines.

Water Customer Shut Off

A customer's service was shut off for non-payment for a home that was vacant for 5 years. Home is now being rented out and owner did not abide payment plan for large back water/sewer bill. Termination notice issued and water shut off at curb. Payment not received and tenants still living at home. Found the valve at curb had been turned back on and meter removed inside so usage would not register. Turned water off again at curb, and owner came in and paid. There are a few other vacant homes in town that haven't paid bills for years and balances are adding up. Attorney Dennis Feeney will look at WWSA enabling legislation to see if town can re-levy these outstanding bills onto the tax bill, so they would become a lien on property vs. filing suit to have judgement issued.

Ballard Road Capital Project

Plans brought to meeting to review with Board.

Bicentennial Trail Foot Path

The Town is looking into making a walking trail through town. One of the proposed routes requested to pass through the Jones Rd water plant property into Gavin Park. The Board feels that for safety reasons, the water plant property should not be made accessible to the general public.

Northway Crossing Capital Project for Proposed Developments

Another developer may be purchasing Don Green's parcel of land and has a preapplication meeting scheduled with the town for 264 homes.
