DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Water Line Extension to Southeast Side of Town

Preliminary design work and route surveys are complete. After the first of the year we will have local banks bid on bond issue.

Water Line Extension for Gavin Park

The project is about 90% complete. Most of the water lines are in but the hydrants need to be installed. We also need to pressure test and disinfect the lines. \$170,000 was reimbursed to Belmonte Builders who will then install the line and the Town of Wilton will reimburse WWSA \$170,000.

Easements from School District and Town

This is done but not recorded yet.

Water System Radio Upgrade Alarm System

This is 100% complete. Now all the information from the SKADA system is coming back to the office thru a cellular modem. This should be quicker and more reliable.

<u>Indian Springs Sewer Upgrade</u>

Next year the whole system will need to be upgraded.

Water Meter Technology

New technology will allow the water meters to be read online. Director Mooney received a preliminary quote for smart meters from Sensus.

Saratoga County Water Quality

There are no updates.

Online and Auto Bill Pay

A new update identifying e-checks from credit card payments will be coming shortly.
